
I obtained the receivers from Bob Slesser. Bob was the OIC of City Subs Installation Melbourne where I worked at the time. These telephone receivers are the original pair first used for successful messages between England and France and were presented by Professor Hughes, the inventor of the microphone to Mr. Despointes,

Manager of the Submarine Telegraph company and given by Mr. Despointers' Son to Thos. Towler New Court St Swithin's Lane.

The letter above, written in 1907, along with the letter at left from Bob Slesser in 1996 shows the progress of these historic receivers into Tony Falzon's collection.
